OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Sub : 3% reservation for Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities of Assam in Class-III and Class-IV State Government jobs, within the OBC quota.

After due consideration and keeping in view the backwardness of Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities notified as MOBC vide Personnel Department's O.M. No. ABP. 338/83/14, dated 04/01/1984, and WPT & BC Department's O.M. No. TAD/BC/128/2020/19, dated 01/03/2001, who are unable to take advantage of the reservation, the State Government has decided for providing with 3% reservation to Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities of Assam in all Class-III and Class-IV posts and services under the State Government and connected with the affairs of the State and in Public Sector Undertakings within the existing 27% quota for OBC/MOBC communities towards adequate representation of these communities in the State Government jobs. The decision of the State Government is an affirmative action for upliftment of Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities as per provisions of the Article 16 of the Constitution of India and the matter of reservation for Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities within the OBC quota needs to be looked into in that context.

The following instructions are issued regarding reservations for Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities in respect of direct recruitment in Class-III and Class-IV posts and services in the State Government and Public Sector Undertakings:

1. Quantum of Reservation

In case of direct recruitment 3% of the cadre strength in Class III and Class IV posts shall be reserved for the Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities. The remaining 24% posts will continue to be reserved for other OBC/MOBC communities notified in the Personnel Department's O.M. No. ABP. 338/83/14 dated 04/01/1984, and WPT & BC Department's O.M. No. TAD/BC/128/2020/19, dated 01/03/2001, while maintaining the overall 27% reservation for OBC/MOBC communities.

A person belonging to Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities cannot be denied the right to compete for appointment against an unreserved vacancy. Persons belonging to Tea Tribes & Adivasi communities who are selected on the basis of merit and not on account of reservation are not to be counted towards the quota reserved for Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities.

2. Effecting Reservation - Maintenance of Rosters

Every Government establishment shall maintain a post based reservation roster for determining/ effecting reservation for Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities for direct recruitment. Each register having a cycle of 100 points shall be divided into 3 blocks comprising the following roster points:

1st Block – R.P. no. 1 to R.P. no. 33.

2nd Block – R.P. no. 34 to R.P. no. 66.

3rd Block – R.P. no. 67 to R.P. no. 100.

Roster point number 6 of the 1st Block, Roster point no. 39 of the 2nd Block and Roster point no. 69 of the 3rd Block shall be treated as reserved for Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities and filled up as such.

Provided that if any vacancy reserved for Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities could not be filled up due to non-availability of eligible Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities candidate, the unfilled vacancy shall not be carried forward to the next year and such vacancies shall be filled up by candidates belonging to OBC/MOBC category other than Tea Tribes and Adivasi

communities. However, the appointing authority shall take steps to maintain 3% reservation for Tea Tribes and Adivasi communities in the subsequent years through the available future vacancies.

These instructions shall come into force with immediate effect. All appointing authorities under the Government of Assam and PSUs will strictly follow the instructions.

In case of any difficulty with regard to implementation of the provisions of this O.M., the concerned authorities may consult Personnel (B) Department through their Administrative Department.
